ENVIRONMENT WORKING GROUP (EWG) TERMS OF REFERENCE

- 1. The working group will consist of a minimum of two councillors.
- 2. Meetings can be held face to face or online or a mixture of both
- 3. Members of the public can be appointed to the working group.
- 4. A quorum shall consist of four people including one councillor.
- 5. No Chairman may hold office for more than three years in succession, unless approved by Full Council.
- 6. Meetings will be held as and when required.
- 7. Notes of the meeting will be written and submitted to Full Council.
- 8. An officer will take notes if present, if not present, a person shall be nominated to do so.
- 9. The EWG has the charter "To Improve and Protect the Parish Environment" and will aim to deliver this via 3 pillars:
 - i) Enhance the AONB and Green areas of the Parish eg tree planting; supporting local fauna and wildlife.
 - ii) Reduce the environmental footprint of the Parish eg promoting sustainable home consumption such as energy and water saving; supporting and enhancing, where reasonably practicable and feasible, council and government environmental initiatives.
 - iii) Encourage residents' ideas on conservation and environmental improvements eg via engaging school children; litter picks. Work with likeminded local environment organisations wherever feasible and reasonably practicable.
- 10. Promote environment policies with committees as appropriate.

- 11. For any large-scale planning applications that have potential environmental impact, the EWG will be able to provide input.
- 12. Invite experts/members of the public to address SPC on environmental topics as deemed appropriate. The Chairman will report to the Parish Council at the monthly Full Council meetings.
- 13. Any proposed expenditure must have approval of the Parish Council or the Finance Committee.
- 14. Update residents via the Newsletter, local magazines, SPC website and social media.

Review

The terms of reference will be reviewed every three years or updated straightaway if there is a significant change.
