

Local Government for Langton Green, Speldhurst, Ashurst and Old Groombridge

Minutes of a Planning Committee Meeting held in the Committee Room, Ashurst Village Hall on Wednesday 20th October 2010 at 7.30pm

MEMBERS PRESENT: Cllrs Mrs Podbury (Chairman), Brown, Ellis, Milner and Wheeler

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC PRESENT: Mr and Mrs Harris – residents of 32 Asher Reeds, Langton Green

- 1. Apologies and Reasons for Absence: Cllr Mrs Hull (prior engagement), Cllr Mrs Paulson-Ellis (prior engagement) and Cllr Langridge (prior engagement)
- 2. **Declarations of Interest:** There were none
- **3. Declarations of Lobbying**: All Councillors were lobbied at the Full Council meeting on 4th October by the architect acting for Bradleys in respect of their development proposals on the Bradleys site in Speldhurst, but no opinion was expressed.
- 4. The Minutes of 30th September 2010 were signed as a correct record.

It was decided to review planning application **TW/10/03084** at this stage so Mr and Mrs Harris could leave before Matters Arising were dealt with.

The comments from members of the public below relate to application TW/10/03084

- Residents stated that they are not against an extension per se but to the size and scale and consider the proposal to be overdevelopment of the plot and overbearing.
- The ground floor area would be more than doubled, it would be built extremely close to their boundary and would limit light to their kitchen and dining area.
- They also consider the statements in the application regarding trees and parking to be
 inaccurate. There is a mature beech hedge and a conifer tree within close proximity within
 falling distance and the roots of which could be adversely affected by the proposal. The
 proposal reduces garage space from 2 cars to 1 car which is likely to have an effect on onstreet parking problems.

TW/10/03084/HOUSE/GM2

Location: 34 Asher Reeds, Langton Green, Royal Tunbridge Wells, Kent

Proposal: Erection of a single-storey rear and side extension

Decision: Recommend refusal

Comment: The proposal is overdevelopment of the plot. The extension wall would be extremely close to the boundary with 32 Asher Reeds and with a pitched roof rather than the existing garage flat roof would be very intrusive and light blockingand overbearing (having an even greater impact because of the difference in ground level of the two plots). The application states that no trees will be affected but there are a mature beech hedge and conifer tree whose roots may be adversely affected and are within falling distance. Concern has been expressed regarding parking with the loss of 1 garage space.

5. Matters Arising:

Bradleys site: Their architect attended the Full Council meeting on 4th October asking if the Parish Council would discuss with them what proposals might be acceptable on this site. The Terms of Reference of the Planning Committee make it clear that the Parish Council are not able to enter any discussions of this nature and all further discussions should be with TWBC.

Quinces planning appeal TW/10/00606/FUL: After discussion it was unanimously agreed that there is nothing further to add to the previous comments made to TWBC. The Parish Council should just reiterate that it supports TWBC decision to refuse the application.

The Grove lighting: There has been an exchange of letters between the Parish Council and TWBC. It is low level lighting not 'street lighting' and will be paid for by the residents of The Grove through a Management Agreement.

Tree Preservation Order – Streamlining Proposals Consultation Document: The assistant clerk reported that she had discussed this with Dan Docker TWBC Tree Officer. He considers the level of protection for trees will be maintained and that it is essentially just a 'tidying up exercise' of administrative anomalies. He is formulating a draft response which he will send to the Parish Council. The Deadline response date is 20th December 2010.

TWBC disk of TPOs within the Parish: The assistant clerk reported that she had spoken further to TWBC and unfortunately there is not a disk that can be supplied. TWBC recommended that anyone who is concerned that unauthorised work is being carried out on trees should report it immediately to TWBC with accurate details of the address and trees.

Land at Heathgate Corner, Langton Green - Enforcement: The assistant clerk reported that TWBC Enforcement are investigating.

Community Right to Build Proposal: The Chairman reported that the Clerk has written a letter of representation to Greg Clark MP.

Night time access to the Sewage Works, Broom Lane, Langton Green: The assistant clerk reported that she had spoken to TWBC who advised that there are no planning constraints on access and that if it is an ongoing concern the Parish Council would be advised to speak directly to Southern Water.
