

Local Government for Langton Green, Speldhurst, Ashurst and Old Groombridge

Minutes of a Planning Committee Meeting held on Wednesday 4th April at 7.30pm in the Gallery Room, Langton Green Village Hall

MEMBERS PRESENT: Cllrs Mrs Price (Chairman), Parker, Mercieca, Mrs Jeffreys, Mrs Soyke, Allen, Ellery and Barrington-Johnson (ex-officio)

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC PRESENT: There were 4 members of the public present.

To enquire if anyone present intends to film, photograph and/or record the meeting: No- one present intended to film, photograph and/or record the meeting.

- 1. To receive and approve apologies and reasons for absence: there were none.
- 2. Disclosure of Interests: there were none.
- **3. Declarations of Lobbying:** A letter had been received from the residents of Owl Lodge, Langton Road, Speldhurst in support of application no. 18/00884/COUNTY.
- 4. Minutes: RESOLVED that the minutes of the Planning Committee meeting held on 7th March 2018 be approved as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

5. Matters Arising:

- Scout Association Quad biking at Adamswell An email had been received by the Clerk from a resident of Adamswell advising of the Scouts' intention to quad bike on the grounds. It was thought the intended route would cross a PROW. Cllr Mrs Price is to contact the Scout Association and the Assistant Clerk is to contact TWBC for their advice.
- 42 Dornden Drive Councillors discussed an email from a resident enquiring about a building on the grounds of 42 Dornden Drive and considered that it had been there some time. They wondered whether the recent cut back of foliage around the building made it more visible now. It was agreed that the Clerk would be asked to write back to the resident saying that it doesn't look like a new construction and advising him to follow the matter up with TWBC if concerned.
- Draft Madeira Park and Warwick Park Conservation Area Consultation Councillors considered the consultation document and there were no comments.
- National Planning Policy Framework Consultations Cllr Mrs Price said that these documents are to be considered at Full Council.

6. Public Open Session: There were 4 members of the public present, all wishing to discuss application no. 18/00884/COUNTY.

Mrs Stephanie Haywood, Headteacher at Speldhurst Primary School spoke first in support of the application. She said the school had three main considerations: rationale; numbers and phasing; and also neighbours' concerns.

She went on to explain that the school had foreseen financial difficulties, due mainly to the government's new funding formula which comes in this April and which has resulted in a deficit prediction for the next three years. There is no possibility the school can continue as it is now on the forecast funding. In addition to this, the new national curriculum requires the pupils to be taught according to their year group and not in the existing system of mixed year classes. Without the expansion and resulting increased funding, the school may need to be restructured which would mean losing its support staff which will affect the existing outstanding provision of the school. The expansion will secure the school's long-term viability and enable the children to be taught according to the new curriculum.

Currently there is no opportunity to offer new families into the village places other than into Reception. She noted that the school gets up to 10 phone calls a week requesting places which shows that the demand for more places is there. Currently the school has 144 children and when at full capacity after an expansion there would be 210 places – the increase would be staggered over the next two years. Mrs Haywood stressed the importance of village children being able to attend their village school. She also stressed that she had been in communication with neighbours to the school and is keen to work closely with them prevent the traffic problems at drop off and pick up becoming worse. She made the following suggestions:

- Allow access through the back gate to the school. This would hopefully also encourage more local families to walk.
- Have a drop off zone outside the school.
- Encourage parking in George and Dragon carpark.
- Introduce staggered start times.

David Turner of Penshurst Road, Speldhurst spoke next in support of the application. He said that his neighbour is having to drive his son to school in Bidborough every day as there isn't space in Speldhurst Primary. He reiterated the point of local children being able to get into their local school. Phua Kia boon who lives near the school spoke next. He has a 5 yearold son who also goes to Bidborough Primary School. He had to drive him there because it is too far and dangerous to walk. He said it is ridiculous he can't get into his local school. It is important for children's friendship groups within the school and village. If the school expands it should be for the benefit of local children within the village. Michael Rock then spoke in support of the application. He is a resident of Speldhurst and has lived in the village for 6 months. One of the key reasons he moved to the village was for the school however his oldest child is currently attending Langton because they have been unable to get into Speldhurst Primary. Cllr Mrs Price asked Mrs Haywood about the timescales involved. Mrs Haywood replied that the school applied last year to the church for funding, but it was unsuccessful. They will hear in May if they have been successful with the new bid. Planning Permission needs to be obtained by the school before the church will consider a grant. The classrooms can be constructed within 6 weeks which can be done during the summer holiday. The children taken in in September and over a period of two years will top up the remaining years to 30 per year.

Decision: Remains neutral – leave to Planning Officer.

Location: Broomlands, Broom Lane, Langton Green, Royal Tunbridge Wells, Kent TN3 ORA Proposal: Alterations to existing access Decision: There was no decision made by Councillors as TWBC have advised the application is currently on hold.

Proposal: TREES: OAK GROUP (T1, T3 and T4) - Reduce height by approx. 20% and thin, clear out dead wood and shape; BEECH (T2) - Reduce height by approximately 20% and thin, clear out dead wood and shape; OAK (T5) - Reduce limbs overhanging the field by 20%, thin, and clear out dead wood

Decision: Remains neutral – leave to Tree Officer.

Location: 15 Roopers, Speldhurst, Royal Tunbridge Wells, Kent TN3 OQL Proposal: Trees: 7 x fir (G3, T26 and T27) – reduce overall height by 25%. Decision: Remain neutral – leave to Tree Officer.

Location: Cedar House, Monteith Close, Langton Green, Royal Tunbridge Wells, Kent TN3 0AD Proposal: Erection of a single storey side and rear extension. Decision: Remain neutral – leave to Planning Officer.

18/00467/FULL

Location: Land and Buildings Barden Road, Speldhurst, Royal Tunbridge Wells, Kent Proposal: Variation of Condition 2 (Approved Plans) of Planning Consent 16/06956/FULL (Part demolition of existing buildings and conversion to provide 3 dwellings with detached car barn and associated landscaping) - Various changes to the approved drawings including change in materials of windows, window on rear elevation to be deeper and change from 3 bedrooms with a family bathroom to 4 bedrooms all with an En Suite.

- Cllr Mercieca raised concern over the recent email from Brenchley Parish Council regarding parish councils being excluded from communications between applicants and TWBC and having to apply for the information via FOI requests. Cllr Mrs Price said it is important that SPC is kept in the loop with conversations that could affect Councillors' decisions on applications and it was agreed to raise the matter with TWBC at the next meeting with them.
